

2017 Delaware County Fair Policies

1. The Delaware County Fair reserves the right to prohibit any protesting on the fairgrounds. If anyone has a concern, the Delaware County Fair will gladly listen and take into account the concern and how it affects the community, but any rallies or protests are prohibited.
2. During fair week, if anyone wishes to sell, inform, or handout any products/pamphlets they must register as a vendor and rent a vendor space in a designated vendor area. Under no circumstances are people allowed to privately advertise or sell merchandise, or distribute documentation without the proper permission of the fair.
3. Any violence on the Fairgrounds will not be tolerated, and any persons involved will be removed from the grounds with no refund on admission or tickets purchased.
4. Bullying, hazing, and discriminating is not tolerated at the Delaware County Fair.
5. The Delaware County Fair will coincide with Iowa's law that individuals are permitted to access those restrooms in accordance with their gender identity, rather than their assigned sex at birth. Gender-segregated bathrooms will be available at the Pavilion, Community Center, Club House, and Hog Barn in addition to the Porta Potties available around the grounds.
6. Underage Drinking Policy: We will not tolerate underage drinking on the Delaware County Fairgrounds property, by any minor under the age of 21. This includes employees, directors and all family members related to employees or directors. We require all persons drinking wear an over 21 wristband to identify that they are of age. Everyone under 30 must show an ID to order a drink or obtain a wristband. We do not allow people to bring in their own alcohol; it must be purchased inside the gate.
7. Smoking Policy: During fair week, the fairgrounds are a smoking-free area. Cigarettes, e-cigarettes, pipes, and any other kind of vapor is prohibited.
8. During the Fair, the only animals, not entered in a contest, allowed on grounds are those that align with the ADA's service animal classification for animals specifically trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities. Animals whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals under the ADA and are therefore not allowed on grounds during the Fair.
9. Refunds on tickets for concerts, admission to the fair or concession purchases will not be given.
10. Every precaution will be taken to properly protect animals and exhibits in all departments. The management, however, will not be liable for the safety of animals, exhibits, attendees or exhibitors, or for the losses sustained because of robbery, damage by fire, accident, civil commotion, or act of God. Exhibitors must do so at their own expense. At all times, exhibitors are liable for the health and behavior of animals they own or show.
